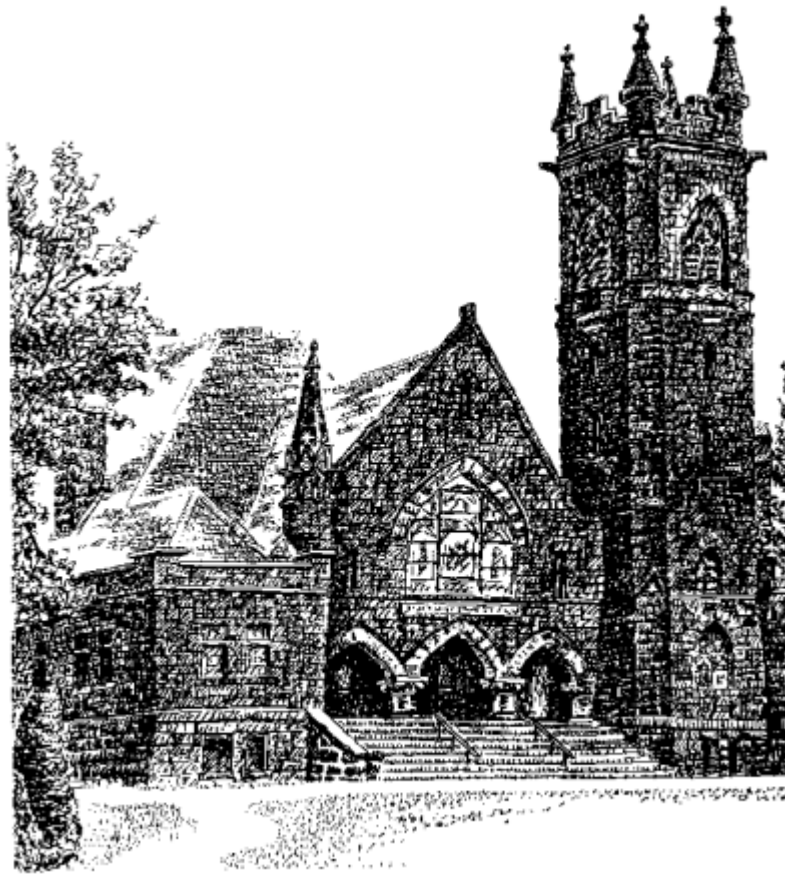

IMPORTANT FAMILY PROMISE (FP) HOSTING AT GRAYSTONE – Please check the Volunteer Chart. We still need one sleepover host to stay with Peggy Eyer on Friday, July 21 and two sleepover hosts Wednesday, July 26. Sara Crumm will be Calvary's host coordinator for July 16 – 22 and Becky Becker will be the host coordinator for July 23 – 30. All FP activities will take place in the house owned by Graystone between Graystone and Zion facing Church Street.

FAMILY PROMISE STORE – If you wish to donate items for the FP store, place them in the red bin marked Family Promise. Items include toothbrushes, toothpaste, paper towels, napkins, dish soap, shampoo, deodorant, body wash, toilet paper in 4-packs, toilet cleaner, all-purpose cleaner, fabric softener sheets and laundry detergent (dry or liquid). You can also get creative, but we are not accepting food items or clothing for FP.

ICCAP PRODUCT OF THE MONTH – In July, we will collect any kind of canned vegetables, including both canned and dried beans, red beets and any variety of canned tomatoes.

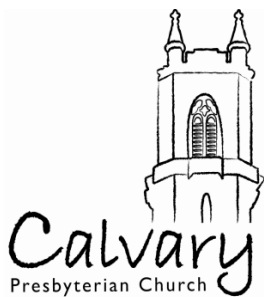
