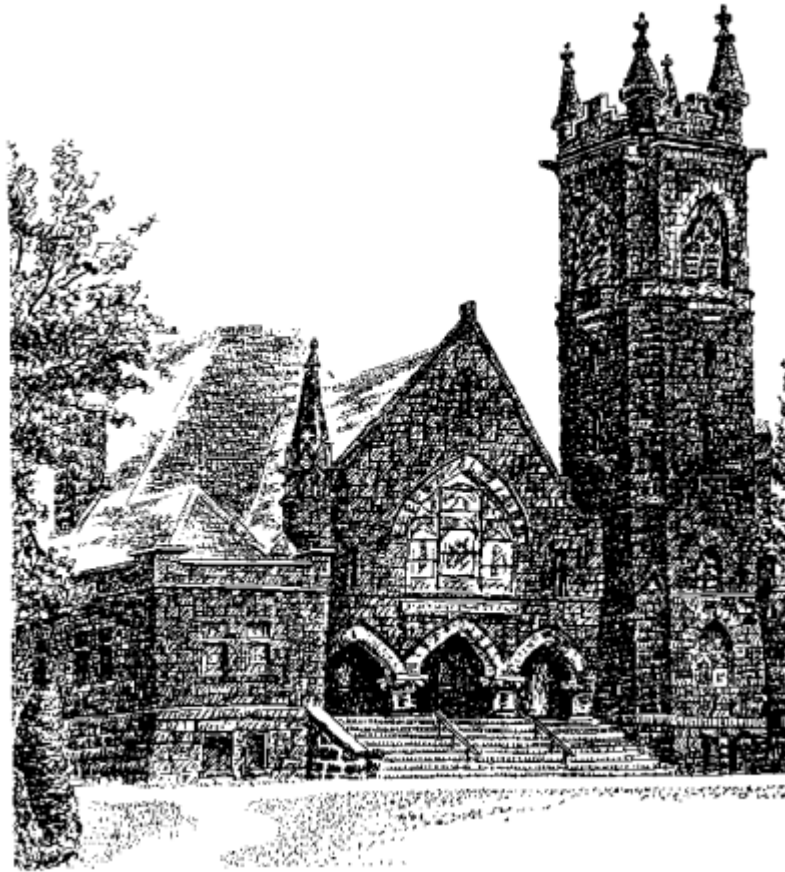

WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY is observed by many Christian churches globally and takes place on the first Sunday of October since 1933. It promotes Christian unity and ecumenicalism. The celebration originated among a group of people at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh. 1933 was a very bleak year with the Great Depression. On the near horizon, the dark clouds of Nazism hovered over Europe and threatened the entire world. The prevailing mood was anxiety and fear about economics, politics and the future.

Access to land to grow food is essential for both indigenous communities long denied right to their ancestral lands as well as to the woman smallholder farmers who grow the vast majority of food consumed around the globe. Ensuring proper nutrition in the first 1,000 days of a child's life is key to their healthy growth and realizing their full potential later in life. They work with communities to find ways to feed themselves sustainably and nutritiously.
