

We invite you to stop by fellowship hour after worship for refreshments, conversation, and information about church programs and volunteer opportunities.

Parking, several professional offices make their parking lots available to church members on Sunday mornings. (That office was once Calvary's manse.) The Indiana Borough Parking Garage is located at 650 Water Street.

CROP HUNGER WALK HELP NEEDED – Don't forget to pick up your CROP Hunger Walk donation envelope on the Mission Table. It's an easy event. All you need is to show up at 12:30 p.m. on October 15, register, have a hot dog, listen to the music and walk on a special route for approximately 45 minutes (and receive some bonuses as you make a few stops). The committee is seeking a few helpers for the Walk. If you are not planning on walking, we need three volunteers to help with grilling hot dogs on a gas grill beginning at 12:30 – 2:00 p.m. on the Church Street lawn preceding the Walk (two for grilling and one to keep supplies coming out from the kitchen). We also need two volunteers to set up and keep a table of condiments and other food items supplied and then clean up at 2:00 p.m. Weather permitting, this food will be provided outside on the lawn until the walkers return at about 1:30 p.m. Please let Becky Becker know if you are willing to help. This outside format is one way to make people notice that hunger is real, the Walk is important, and it is a fun activity! YOU can help abate hunger by walking, rocking, or just being present. All checks turned in that day must be written payable to CWS/CROP so that they can be sent out to CWS right away. Receipts will be available that day.

BLANKETS FOR ARCADIA – Thank you to those who donated blankets to Arcadia. They were delivered to the Arcadia Presbyterian Church food bank on Friday and will be distributed with the October food distribution. We will not be collecting any more blankets until possibly January.
