

(That office was once Calvary's manse.) The Indiana Borough Parking Garage is located at 650 Water Street.

Arcadia Food Pantry is provided monthly ICCAP standard offerings and additional food is donated from many churches in the Kiskiminetas Presbytery. Our month here at Calvary is January. Arcadia has a rather small storage area; therefore, requests for blankets are only considered twice a year, at the most and at this time they have not requested blankets. Lists of suggested food donations are available on the Mission Table. You may deviate from the list, providing all donations are non-perishable with a long shelf life.
