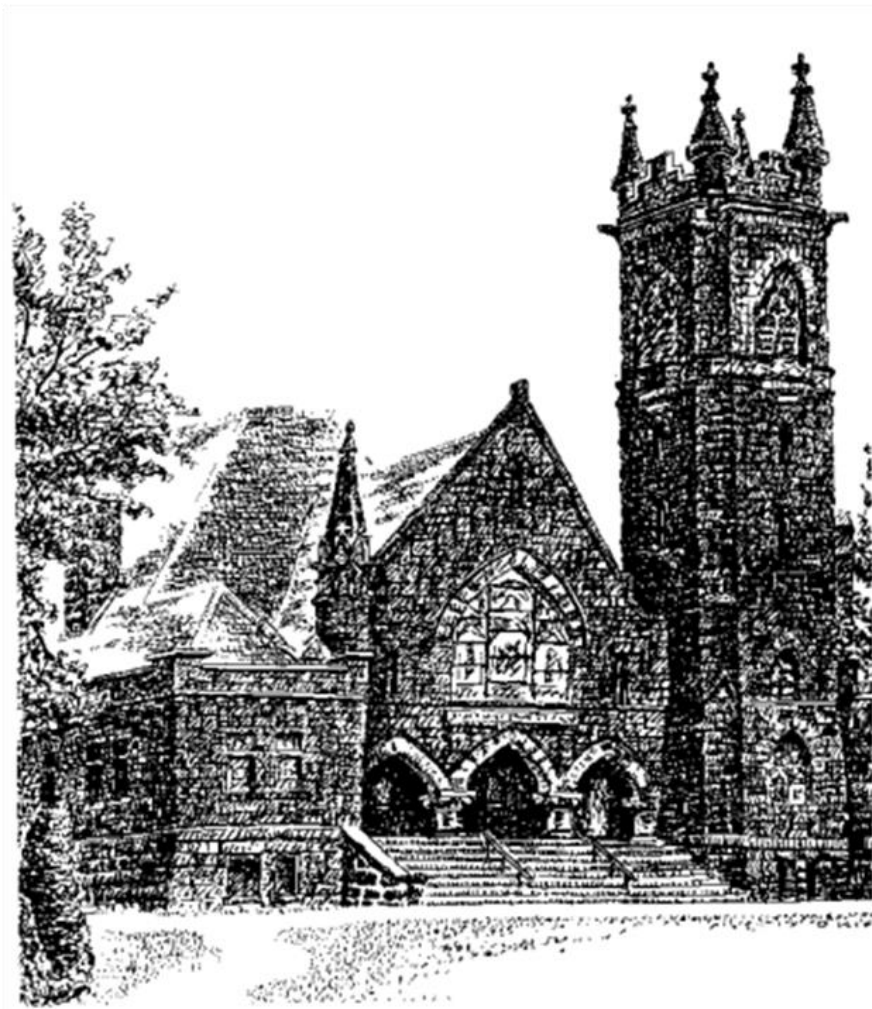

(That office was once Calvary's manse.) The Indiana Borough Parking Garage is located at 650 Water Street.
