CALVARY'S EASTER BANNER – Calvary's three-part Easter wall hanging is composed of symbols which celebrate this most holy festival of the church calendar. At the center is the monogram, formed by two Greek letters "chi" (X) and "rho" (P), of Christ. This much used symbol of the early church is found in ancient Christian catacombs. The suns signify the joyful day of resurrection. The lilies are symbols of immortality. The bulb decays in the ground, yet from it new life is released. Butterflies also are symbolic of resurrection and eternal life. As the butterfly leaves the pupa and soars upward with a new body, so through Jesus Christ are his followers born to a new life by the death of the body.

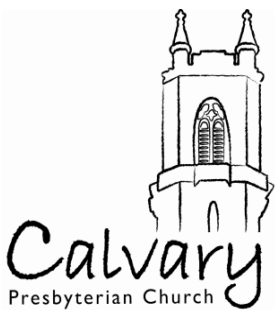
