

Some other examples include a family who has had a fire, a mother or father who has been laid off, a little surprise for a child, a neighbor who is going through a rough time, a stranger on the street (wherever you are), an award for a person who has done a favor for you or someone who lives alone – no need for the person to be poor. We have all summer and you can take more than one Kindness Kit. If you really feel the spirit, why not make some kits of your own! How easy it is to be kind. This is an open-ended project and there are no rules "carved in stone."

CHURCH CRISIS COMMITTEE (CCC) – We have just been through a long winter and CCC has just about depleted their funds for helping Indiana County families with utilities. NEW HYMNALS

Dear Member of Calvary Presbyterian Church,

As you may have heard by now, the Session, following the recommendation of the Worship Committee has approved the purchase of the new Presbyterian hymnal: *Glory to God*. We want to explain the reasons for this decision and ask your help in implementing it.

New hymnals appear about once in a generation – 20 to 25 years – and our current hymnal, published in 1990, is now 28 years old. It is hard to imagine that it will still fully meet the needs of our congregation 20 to 25 years from now when it will be nearly a half-century old. Styles of worship and music change over time and a living church, if it is to remain relevant to new generations of Christians must be open to changes too – holding on to what has lasting value and at the same time welcoming the best of the new.

Glory to God has 40% more items in it – 853 vs. 605 – than our current hymnal. As is always the case with a new hymnal, some songs have been lost, but most of these are ones we never, or only rarely, use and others are alternative tunes for hymns that remain in the new hymnal with their more familiar tune. We are particularly excited by major additions to the Advent/Christmas and the Lent/Easter selections. Also a number of old gospel hymns are back: Leaning on the Everlasting Arms, Rock of Ages, Standing on the Promises, I Love to Tell the Story, It is Well with my Soul, Shall We Gather at the River, Softly and Tenderly, Mine Eyes Have Seen the Glory. Many of you will welcome the opportunity to sing them again. There are other new additions, some of which the choir has already used and others that will be familiar to you from time spent in other churches.


So we think that adopting *Glory to God* is the right thing to do and that now is the time to do it. We estimate that we will need to purchase about 360 new hymnals at \$20 each. We have already received some pledges of support for this project, but we want your help too. As we did when we adopted our present hymnal, we want to provide an opportunity for you to honor, memorialize, and/or present to loved ones, on a bookplate in the hymnal or hymnals you purchase. Please use the enclosed form to indicate how many hymnals you wish to purchase as well as the names of those you want to honor, memorialize, or present to. We are hoping that we will be able to have a complete set of new hymnals in the sanctuary to dedicate and begin using in September.


