

IF YOU ARE NEW TO CALVARY



- Be willing to help manage the physical and financial well-being of the church

Ruling Elder, responsibilities, such as:

- Attend monthly Session meeting
- Work on a committee
- Serve Communion
- Serve as a commissioner to a Presbytery meeting

Deacon, qualifications (see Book of Order, G-2.0201):

- Be a person of spiritual character, honest repute, exemplary lives, brotherly and sisterly love, sincere compassion, and sound judgement
- Be willing to share in the redeeming love of Jesus Christ for the poor, the hungry, the sick, the lost, the friendless, the oppressed, and anyone in distress

Deacon, responsibilities, such as:

- Attend monthly Board of Deacons meetings
- Serve on a standing committee
- Serve as Deacon of the Week approximately three times a year
- VIP (Very Important Presbyterians) Assignments
- Serve on Communion set-up and clean-up committee roughly three times a year
